


Reporting

- Junior Cycle will build on reporting currently carried out at Primary level
- Reporting will happen in first, second and third-year
- First-year reporting will focus on student learning and selfdevelopment
- Second and third-year reporting will include the school-based components that will form part of the Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement
- The NCCA will develop templates for providing these reports to students and parents



Junior Cycle Subjects:



10 subjects for Junior Cycle, as follows:

- Gaeilge
- English
- Maths
- Science
- Spanish
- Geography
- 2 Short Courses (=1 subject): Well-being plus STEM or Chinese
- Three optional subjects from History, Music, Art, Business, Home Economics, Technology, Technical Drawing.
- PLUS: Other Learning Experiences: PE, CSPE & Religion.

ENGLISH

Introduced to first years in 2014-2015 For certification in autumn 2017

- The subject specification in English was introduced to students entering first year in 2014.
- Short Courses were available for schools to introduce in 2014.
- Level 2 Learning Programmes for students with particular special educational needs have been available from September 2014.

SCIENCE AND BUSINESS STUDIES

Introduced to first years in 2016-2017 For certification in autumn 2019

- **Subject specifications** in Science and Business Studies to be introduced for students entering first year in September 2016.
- This is the last year that the existing CSPE syllabus can be offered for examination to incoming first years.

IRISH, MODERN LANGUAGES AND ART, CRAFT & DESIGN Introduced to first years in 2017-2018 For certification in autumn 2020

- Subject specifications in Irish, Modern Languages (French, German, Spanish, Italian) and Art, Craft & Design to be introduced for students entering first year in September 2017.
- This is the last year that the existing Environmental and Social Studies syllabus can be offered for examination to incoming first years.

MATHS, HOME ECONOMICS, HISTORY, MUSIC AND GEOGRAPHY

Introduced to first years in 2018-2019 For certification in autumn 2021

- Subject specifications in Maths, Home Economics, History, Music and Geography to be introduced for students entering first year in September 2018.
- The current Junior Certificate examination in CSPE is being examined for the last time in June 2019.

TECHNOLOGY SUBJECTS, RELIGIOUS EDUCATION, JEWISH STUDIES & CLASSICS Introduced to first years in 2019-2020 For certification in autumn 2022

 Subject specifications in the technology subjects (Materials Technology / Wood, Technical Graphics, Metalwork, Technology), Religious Education, Jewish Studies and Classics to be introduced for students entering first year in September 2019.

A changing assessment culture



- Assessment in support of learning
- Assessment focused on offering effective feedback
- Greater variety of assessment activity "fit for purpose" and relevant to students
- Teachers talking to teachers about assessment
- Building capacity, knowledge and confidence in assessment, in schools









Exams will be set, held and marked by the State Examinations Commission in June of third year.

- English, Irish and Maths specified at Higher and Ordinary levels
- All other subjects specified at a Common Level
- Duration of 2 hours or less










Classroom-Based Assessments


Aim:

How has Assessment changed with Junior Cycle English?

Assessment	Key Elements	Deadline
Classroom-Based Assessment (C.B.A.)		
1. Oral Communication Task	Individual or group presentation	End of 2nd Year / Beginning of 3rd Year
2. Collection of Student Texts	Texts produced over time by student	December of 3rd Year
Assessment Task	Worth 10% Builds on work from C.B.A. Marked by State Examinations Commission	Following completion of the second Classroom-Based Assessment (December of 3rd Year)
Final Assessment	Worth 90% One two-hour written examination paper Higher or Ordinary Level Marked by State Examinations Commission	End of 3rd Year


A studied **novel**, with on-going, sustained reading through the year

At least 10 poems



Guidelines:



- Two novels (From choice of 20 prescribed novels)
- Two drama texts (From choice of 16 prescribed drama texts, one must be Shakespearean drama)
- Film / Documentary / Travel Text / Biography (From choice of 10 films)
- At least 16 poems
- Non-literary texts
- A number of short stories





- Students' Collection of Texts (10% of First Year Christmas Exam)
- Creative Writing Tasks
